CREATOR OF RECORDS:

Ownership Interests and Formation

The whaling company Hektor was founded in October 1910 in Tønsberg at the initiative of Consul Finn Bugge. The object of the company was to carry out whaling in the South Shetland Islands, Falkland Islands and South Orkney. The company's general manager was the N. Bugge Company and among those responsible for the share subscription were L. Dahl Jr. and Finn Bugge. L. Dahl Jr. had also played a key role in 1889 in founding the whaling company Viktor, which had for a number of years carried out whaling operations from Iceland. The numbers of whales caught off the coast of Iceland had begun to decline, however, and the company was wound down in February 1911. By winding down Viktor, N. Bugge was able to free up capital and whaling material so that he could begin whaling in the new, profitable areas around the South Shetland Islands in the Antarctic. The establishment of Hektor was the start of a long-term cooperation between the N. Bugge Company and a number of both Norwegian and British whaling companies. In 1911, when AS Hektor was granted its licence, 15 companies were involved in whaling activities around South Georgia and the South Shetland Islands. In addition to its licence and being granted sole rights to establish a land-based station, Hektor was granted a licence for whaling activities with a floating factory and whaling vessels in British territorial waters. Over time the company was granted several favourable licences through, among other things, the acquisition of AS Hvalen (A-1583) in 1914.

Whaling Licences

Great Britain, which in 1908 had claimed sovereignty over the area, regulated whaling through the issuing of permits and whaling licences. In 1907 the British authorities wished to impose certain restrictions to the granting of whaling licences, and wanted to impose more stringent conditions. In 1908, in compliance with new provisions, the Whale Fishery Ordinance was drawn up which granted the Governor of the Falkland Islands extended powers of authority to regulate the extent of whaling activities. The ordinance was followed up with a number of new provisions in 1912. The licence that permitted AS Hektor to hunt for whales in the 1911/12 season was signed on 1 April 1911 in Stanley, the capital of the Falkland Islands. It gave Captain Krogh-Hansen, on behalf of AS Hektor, permission to catch whales in the waters off the South Shetlands and Graham's Land.

The First Whaling Seasons

Taking part in Hektor's first whaling season was the floating factory *Ronald* and three whalers *T.H. Dahl*, *Mjøfjord* and *Lauritz Berg*. Expedition manager was Captain H. Krogh-Hansen. The first season was a success, yielding a net profit of NOK 189,000. At an extraordinary general meeting it was decided to increase the company's share capital by NOK 200,000. In addition, shareholders received a dividend payment of 32 per cent. In the next whaling season (1911/12), Captain C. S. Christensen was appointed manager, succeeding Krogh-Hansen who became a partner in the N. Bugge Company.

Establishment of the Land-based Station in Whalers Bay

Unique harbour conditions at Deception Island made the island an ideal main base for the whaling fleet in the South Shetland Islands. The ice-free harbour and access to fresh water all year round meant the island was well-suited as a whaling base and ideal for the establishment of a permanent land-based whaling facility. When the two floating factories *Hektoria* and *Ronald* left Tønsberg in September 1912, they had with them the equipment they needed to establish a shore station, among other things building materials to construct a meat cooker, a guano factory and a mess and barracks. On their arrival at Deception Island, building work began immediately, and by New Year construction work on the land-based station had come so far that it was possible to start trials with the meat cooking plant and the guano factory.

The next season, when the floating factories arrived at Deception Island in mid-November, work continued on construction of the second half of the station. The facility was completed according to plan after a short period of time. Over the ensuing years, the land-based station was supplied with equipment on a continuous basis, and in the autumn of 1914 several water tanks were erected as well as two additional guano driers.

Joint Operations with AS Hvalen 1914–1928

In 1914, a proposal was submitted by the management of AS Hektor to acquire a majority shareholding in A/S Hvalen and to take over operation of the company. Also included in the purchase were the floating factory *Hvalen* and the three whalers *Minerva*, *Fogo* and *Dantas Barrato*. The company thereby gained access to yet another whaling licence and was now in a position to catch whales and process them with the aid of three floating factories and a land-based station. With effect from the operating year 1914/15, a joint annual report was published for the two companies, but the accounts were kept separate. Joint operation of the companies continued right up until 1928 when AS Hvalen was wound down and AS Hektor acquired Hvalen's assets.

Whaling During the First World War

In the autumn of 1914, the three floating factories *Hektoria*, *Benguela* and *Hvalen* were considerably delayed in reaching the whaling area. Their late arrival was partly due to acts of war around the Falkland Islands and partly due to a massive belt of floating ice preventing ships from reaching the whaling waters. Despite the delayed start to the whaling season, catches were good that year.

The onset of the First World War meant higher outfitting and manning expenses for the whaling fleet. There were increases in the price of coal, as well as higher insurance and payroll expenses. The company considered it unprofitable to send the floating factories out for a new whaling season in 1915. In the two ensuing seasons, the floating factories were used for freight traffic, yielding good profits. In 1917, however, both *Hektoria* and *Benguela* sank, but *Hvalen* continued to operate as a freighter until March 1918, when it

sank too. In the subsequent season, the company's whalers were chartered out for whaling in the South Shetland Islands and South Georgia. The task of contracting new floating factories to replace those that had sunk was an ongoing process, but it was not until 1920 that it was possible to resume whaling, when the new floating factory *Ronald* was commissioned carry out whaling and production from the land-based station was resumed.

Amendments to the Articles of Association in 1923 and a Dispute Concerning the General Manager's Rights

At a general meeting in 1923 it was decided that the company's board of directors should consist exclusively of the Bugge Company represented by owners Finn Bugge and H. Krogh-Hansen. The remaining board members were to be appointed to the board of representatives. In the longer term this triggered a dispute between certain shareholders and the N. Bugge Company regarding the size of the general manager's remuneration for provisioning and outfitting. It was pointed out on several occasions that the close links to the companies' general manager was not necessarily beneficial for AS Hektor.

Whaling in the 1920s

In 1920, AS Hvalen purchased *Maudie* which used as a freighter. In accounting terms, both companies posted a deficit in 1921, and in 1922 *Maudie* was converted into a floating factory and put into use for whaling purposes. The numbers of whales caught in the subsequent years fluctuated, and it was not until 1926 that catches around the South Shetland Islands were good. Old whaling vessels were gradually replaced with new ones, and in 1929 the floating factories *Ronald* and *Maudie* were converted so that they could be used for whaling anywhere around the South Shetland Islands and in the floating ice. In addition, the freighter *Hektor*, which had been contracted in 1928, was outfitted so that it could be used as a floating factory.

The Final Whaling Season from the Shore Station on Deception Island

In 1930, *Melville* was purchased as a transport ship for the land-based station and seven new whaling vessels were ordered. A comprehensive expedition was dispatched to the whaling area in 1930, consisting of three floating factories and a total of 16 whaling vessels, two buoy boats and a tanker to carry out whaling both by the floating ice and around the South Shetland Islands. The expedition returned in the spring of 1931 and had to be laid up immediately. Overproduction and a financial crisis led to a collapse in the market, and the entire Norwegian and part of the foreign whaling fleet was laid up in the 1931/32 season.

Cooperation between AS Hektor, Hector Whaling Limited and Hektor Ltd.

As mentioned previously, AS Hvalen was dissolved in 1928 and AS Hektor took over AS Hvalens's assets and licences. That same year, Hektor entered into a contract with the British company Hector Whaling Ltd. regarding future cooperation, an agreement in which for a twenty year period Hektor undertook to transfer its production to the British

company in return for which the British company would pay all operating costs incurred by Hektor, and pay a regular dividend payment of 15 per cent to shareholders and one-fifth of profits from the sale of production. Hektor would continue operations under the same management, with the same functions and the same material, and continue to operate under the Norwegian flag. This occurred with the consent of the British authorities (Colonial Office). Under the terms of the contract, Hektor Whaling Ltd. would only be responsible for the sale of oil and would stand as a borrower. In addition, it was a requirement that Hektor's general managers would be on the board of directors of Hektor Whaling Ltd. In 1930, Nils Ronald Bugge and Harald Krogh-Hansen were made co-owners of the N. Bugge Company and became at the same time joint general managers of AS Hektor.

For tax reasons, it was decided in 1932 to transfer a considerable part of Hektor's material under the British flag. This was done by establishing the British company Hektor Ltd. (A-1584). The company, with its headquarters in London, was founded in the same year by Nils Ronald Bugge and Harald Krogh-Hansen. The company had the same board of directors as Hektor Whaling Limited; all the shares in the company, except for two, were owned by Hektor. Finn Bugge's British son-in-law Rupert Trouton was the director of Hektor Whaling Ltd.

Moratorium from 1932, 1934 and Reconstruction of the Company after 1935

Catches over the next couple of years varied and the company's financial status weakened. The company applied for and was granted a moratorium (debt deferral), initially for a period of two years, which was then extended for an additional two years until 1936. It emerged that this was not sufficient time and attempts were made to put in place a moratorium that would last for 10 years. Following repeated negotiations between the company, its creditors and the Norwegian authorities, the company was successful in achieving a reconstruction of the company in 1936. Among other things, agreements were negotiated concerning future joint operations with, among others, United Whalers Ltd., which in the longer term led to a partial transfer of whaling rights relating to the shore station in Whalers Bay.

After Hektor had finally managed to negotiate new "trading agreements" with opportunities for joint operations with the British companies, the Second World War broke out and further cooperation between the companies was stopped. In 1939, Hektor owned only three whaling vessels, which were requisitioned during the war by the Norwegian authorities in London. After the war ended, the company received a settlement from Nortraship. The company's three whalers were sold to Hektor Whaling in 1947, at virtually the same time as the business agreement between AS Hektor and Hektor Whaling Ltd. was dissolved.

The Period after 1945 and More Recent Partner Constellations

After 1946, operations were essentially limited to the field of shipping with, among other things, the two motor tankers *Hektor* and *Benguela*. One exception was the 1948 season, where whaling was carried out from the land-based station at Tetuan in Spanish Morocco. In reality, the operative part of AS Hektor's operations had been transferred after 1945 to a number of partners such as Bugge & Krogh-Hansen (A-1593), N.R. Bugges skipsaksjeselskap [N.R. Bugge's Shipping Company] (A-1595) and AS F.A. Bugge (A-1853). In 1984, a merger took place between a number of Bugge companies, including AS Hektor, and the company was formally dissolved in 1985.

THE ARCHIVE:

AS Hektor's archives comprise approx. 14.5 linear shelf metres spanning the years 1910 to 1985.

The close business links between general manager N. Bugge, the companies AS Hektor and AS Hvalen have been described previously. This cooperation has naturally had consequences for the way in which the archive has been compiled, and for this reason similar types of documents will be found in several locations. This means that most of the documentation produced after 1917 can be found in the N. Bugge archive (A-1326).

Since N. Bugge was general manager of AS Hektor and thus also responsible for operations and the hiring of crew members and outfitting of ships, a large part of the correspondence, case archives and crew lists will be found there.

It was first in 1929 that a more formalized agreement was entered into that established that the N. Bugge Company should have "full responsibility for bookkeeping, correspondence and the day-to-day running" of AS Hektor.

General management and several of the companies were operated from N. Bugge's offices in Tønsberg. An archive key was preserved in 1940 which was probably used some time during the 1920s.

AS Hektor's archive consists of the following series:

A – Governing Bodies, 1910–1985

This series consists of meeting books from the company's governing bodies, and are divided into three sub-series. After AS Hektor's purchase of AS Hvalen in 1914 and the subsequent joint operation of the companies, a joint annual report was issued. Nevertheless, the companies remained separate legal entities, and their accounts were kept separate. At the end of the series are case documents and vouchers relating to amendments to the articles of association and rules. Documentation relating to shares can be found in series G.

B – Letter Books, 1910–1915

This series has been finely sorted and consists of letters and telegrams sent to the company's business contacts. The series is arranged partly by business contact, and partly chronologically. Correspondence after 1917 can be found in the N. Bugge archive.

D – Letters and Telegrams – Common to AS Hektor and AS Hvalen, 1910–1916

This series is partly arranged in alphabetical order by business contact. Correspondence relating to operations in AS Hektor and AS Hvalen can also be found in the N. Bugge AS archive A–1326 Pa 258.

F – Equipment and Fixtures and Fittings, 1910–1940

This series consists of lists of equipment in the company's floating factories, whaling vessels and shore station, including overviews of machinery, deck equipment, galley stocks, and provisions and whaling equipment. The lists are arranged according to the individual whaling seasons.

G – Vessel Documentation and Whaling Journals, 1910–1931

The series is divided into two sub-series. The vessel documentation contains information that helps determine the route taken by the vessels together with special events. These include documentation of numbers of whales caught, weather and ice conditions, in addition to events relating to crew members. The log provides important documentary evidence of accidents or injuries that occurred during voyages. The whaling journals list numbers of whaling vessels and crew members, information concerning the number of whales caught and an indication of the time and position at which catches were made.

H – Shares and Shareholders, 1910–1989

Documentation of the company's shares and shareholders. Correspondence relating to the transfer of shares, in 1928 among other things, can be found at the end of the series.

P – Crews, 1912–1934

This series is divided into three sub-series. See also crew lists in the N. Bugge archive series Pa. Crew lists for individual whaling seasons have been saved only sporadically;

those that are available cover the years 1912 to 1914. Central crew documentation can also be found in employment contracts. Contracts for selected crew categories such as manager, captain and telegrapher covering the entire whaling period from Deception Island.

There are two doctor's journals containing documentation about patients with diagnoses and treatment. Health-related information of a more general nature may be found in medical reports in the Dba correspondence series in the N. Bugge archive (A-1326). Last in the series is payroll information arranged by name (see also the Rca series – Crew list books). Furthermore, it is important to note that the series with vouchers contains supplementary documentation relating to payroll lists for crews prepared by the captain or whaling manager.

Q – Agreements and Contracts, 1912–1947

This series contains contracts relating to both production and to the company's floating material, including agreements concerning purchases, chartering and insurance of vessels and equipment. The same category of documentation will also be found in the N. Bugge (A-1326) archive in series F and H. Last in the series is important preserved information on "trading agreements" and other sets of agreements relating to moratoria (debt restructuring agreements) for the years 1928 to 1947. Supplementary documentation about this matter can also be found in N. Bugge (A-1326) series Dc.

R - Accounts, 1910–1983

The series is divided into six sub-series (see discussion under each sub-series in the archives list). It is important to note that accounting documentation can be found here for AS Hektor, AS Hvalen and N. Bugge for the period up to 1928.
